Do you provide information to staff, members and clients about where to seek help for gambling harm?		
Do you hold social or staff functions at venues that have poker machines or TAB©?		
Do you allow staff to access gambling websites and apps on work computers and mobile devices?		
Are your managers/coordinators or committee members aware of how to recognise that someone is experiencing gambling harm and do they know what to do?		
Do your staff/member induction programs include information about gambling harm?		
Do you have a gambling policy or a responding to disclosures policy that includes gambling harm?		
Does your organisation/club or group accept donations or sponsorship from gambling venues/ providers?		
Does your CEO/senior management/club president or chairperson support preventing gambling harm and support for members and staff?		
Do you provide support information for your staff in accessible formats i.e for people with a disability, migrant and refugee people?		
Do your policies and procedures take into consideration the needs of people experiencing gambling harm? i.e. club membership fees and payment plans, personal leave to attend financial counselling etc.
